From the Community Spiritual Director

I have had a love/hate relationship with auto mechanics most of my life. I know nothing about the mechanical part of cars, and therefore have been at the mercy of the mechanics who work on mine. I love them because they keep my cars going, I hate them because sometimes I've had them take advantage of me and my friends.

Years ago the a/c in my car stopped working. I went to a chain auto repair business. After looking at my car for 5 minutes they told me the entire a/c system was out and would cost me \$600. This was over 30 years ago, and that was a lot of money for a mill village preacher. I decided to just drive around with my windows open for the summer. I mentioned it to one of my church members. He asked if I had taken it to Bo Rothrock. Bo was a quiet country man who sat in the back of the church each week. He hardly said a word, but was faithful in his attendance. He had a small cement block building on Pine Street in Spartanburg where he and his son worked on cars. There were always a lot of cars with their hoods up parked on the lot.

I stopped by to see Bo, told him my problem, asked him to take a look at it and tell me how much it would cost. I left the car with him and walked back to the church. A few hours later he called me and said the car was ready and the a/c was working. Oh no! He had repaired my car. I did not know how much it was, or if I could afford to pay him. This would be especially embarrassing, since I was his pastor. I walked to the lot, shook Bo's hand, and asked what I owed. "Five dollars," he said. "Five dollars! Are you sure?" I asked. I did not want him doing something that cost him a lot of money and then not letting me pay. Many preachers I had heard of have tried to get by with that. It is embarrassing. "Yep," he said. "You just had a small bolt come off the motor and it wasn't able to turn. The bolt cost 50 cents and I'm charging you \$4.50 for my boy's time. Reckon you can afford that?"

I later found out that Bo never fixed anything that wasn't broken, if he fixed something and it broke later he repaired it for free, and he would often do his work for less than cost or free for people who were in need. No wonder his lot was always full. I asked him about it one time, why he was so good. He said this, "Preacher, you know I can't preach, I can't teach the Bible, and I can't even pray out loud very good. But I can fix a car. And when everything is running just right, it sounds like God is humming to me." Bo had found his calling in life. Not just his occupation, but his vocation, his calling.

This month we celebrate Labor Day weekend. English essayist Joseph Addison wrote, "The grand essentials of happiness are something to do, something to love, and something to hope for." According to the Bible, meaningful work was the first gift God gave humanity (Genesis 2:15). We all want occupations, jobs that provide for ourselves and our families. But more than just a job, we desire a vocation, a calling, something that gives meaning to the things we do day to day. If you have not found yours, here's hoping and praying you keep looking until you do.

From Florence: Go toward Conway on 501 and the church is on the right about a mile and a half from where 22 intersects with 501

From North Myrtle, Little River area: Take 90 south to 22 towards Conway to 501 east. The church is about a mile and a half on the right.

From Myrtle Beach: 501 through Conway toward Aynor. Church is about 2 miles past Tractor Supply on the left. Look for Dollar General.
