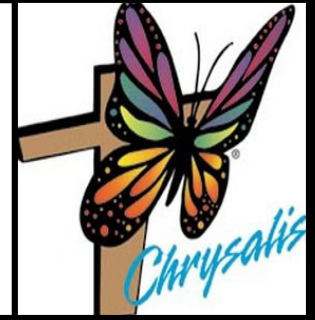

Fear and Good News

“And the angel said unto them, Fear not: for, behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people.”- Luke 2:10

Excuse the King James language, but that’s how I always think angels speak. And the first thing they always have to say is “Fear not.” Every time an angels shows up in the Bible the first thing they have to tell people is “don’t be afraid.” Unlike our current image of angels- wings, white gowns, great beauty- they must be a pretty fearsome thing to behold. And just suddenly appearing in the midst of people would be pretty scary, too.
